

Cllr Allan Harvey



Halewood Town Council and the wider Halewood community was saddened to hear of the death of longstanding and well-liked elected member, Cllr Allan Harvey over the Christmas period.

Allan Harvey first joined Halewood Town Council as a Councillor between 1983 and 1987. Due to work and family commitments he had to step back from this role. But, once elected in 2011, Allan remained a Town Councillor until the end of his life. Allan was Mayor of Halewood in 2015/16 and Deputy Mayor on several occasions – including the current Municipal Year. Allan was also a Borough Councillor for the Halewood South Ward, retaking this seat as an Independent in 2018.. In addition to politics, Allan was also a keen advocate of culture and one of his passions within Halewood was championing the Annual Christmas Concert funded and facilitated by the Town Council. A family man with a great sense of humour he will be greatly missed.
