

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORTGeorge MacKenzie

Town Manager



It's that time of the year again when I look back trying to sum up the last twelve months in a few paragraphs... an almost impossible task!

This time last year I described the preceding twelve months as 'busy' 'enjoyable and eventful' 'whilst at times being a challenge' and I can honestly say 2015-2016 has been no different.

The major challenge faced by the Town Council this year, as mentioned elsewhere in this report, has been managing its resources within the increasingly difficult financial constrains placed upon it by Central Government. The further reduction in Council Tax Reduction Scheme Grant (CTRSG) funding in 2015-2016, and yet more in 2016-2017, has contributed significantly to the Town Council resolution to increase the precept in 2016-2017 by 10%, the equivalent of £5.88 per annum at Band D equivalent level.

This increase, the first for two years, will however, enable the Town Council to meet its net expenditure during 2016-2017 including the continued payment of the Living Wage to its lowest paid employees. Moving forward, we are uncertain over what timescale the CTRSG will be phased out in Knowsley (the Government has announcement that it is to be phased out completely in England by 2020) but doubtless tough times lie ahead.

Even though the Town Council faced difficult financial challenges this year, it still recognised that some of our families are themselves facing similar worries. So with the support, as ever, of our Primary Schools, and because Members considered it the right thing to do, the Town Council set aside a fund directly to help those in most need

On the brighter side, the Town Council was delighted to support, both practically and financially, the Halewood Christmas concert at which again the massed choir were a credit to themselves, their families, schools and the whole community.

August saw the launch of our new website www.halewoodtowncouncil.gov.uk. This improved site, contains up to date information about the Town Council; its facilities and activities, news, agendas and minutes

Here at the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre, we welcomed this year, Knowsley Dementia Care - Memory Lane as regular, twice weekly users of the Centre; every Monday evening we now have an Open Mic night which is gaining popularity and plans are being formulated, funding permitting, to upgrade the synthetic pitches and kitchen facilities.

Over in Hollies Hall, in partnership with FirstArk, we are seeking funding to replace the equipment in the children's playground. The Town Council recently also purchased a defibrillator, courtesy of the Oliver King Foundation to be available for users of Hollies Hall and the site generally. This life saving piece of equipment was presented to the Mayor of Halewood, Cllr Allan Harvey, by Mark King, Oliver's dad, a truly inspirational person.

The Town Council now has a defibrillator in both of its Centres.

Supporting many activities, groups and individuals during the year; Halewood Culturefest, Halewood Community Spirit, Memory Lane, Halewood U3A, Torrington Drive Community Association (to name but a few), recognising the wonderful children and young people in our community through our Pupil Recognition Awards and

our Community Achievement Award winners, our Community Grant recipients, have all been highlights during the year.

Sadly, we said farewell recently to former Town Councillors Tommy Cartin and Alice Blackhurst and we offer our prayers and sympathy to their families at this sad time for them.

'Busy' 'enjoyable' 'eventful' 'a challenge'.... yes 2015-2016 has been all that and more. I am beginning to think every year will be...

To all of the Community Groups and Association, to our Schools and the Academy, to our Children's Centres, and the very many other partners with whom we have worked during the year a heartfelt thank you. Your support has been invaluable.

Thank you also to ClIr Allan Harvey and his fellow Town Councillors, and all the staff of the Town Council who have helped and supported me during the year, without you it would not have been possible, or necessary!.

Our facilities are here for you, come and take a look, try us out!

ABOUT HALEWOOD TOWN COUNCIL

COUNCIL STRUCTURE

The responsibility of the Council is to take policy decisions about how it's services are carried out, what the priorities should be and how the Council's resources should be allocated.

Each year, at the Annual Meeting, the Council elects a Chairperson who becomes the Mayor of Halewood for the forthcoming year. For 2015-2016 the Chairperson (Leader) of the Council and Mayor of Halewood, was ClIr Allan Harvey who was supported by his daughter and Mayoress of Halewood, Suzanne Harvey.

PUBLIC ACCESS TO MEETINGS

Members of the public are welcome to attend any meeting of the Town Council, although there are occasions when meetings must go into 'private session' when dealing with matters of a confidential nature. A thirty minute Public Forum is available at all Town Council meetings when, preferably by written prior arrangement with the Town Manager, members of the public in attendance at the meeting may address the Town Council on matters appertaining to the Township.

Meetings normally start at 7 p.m and subject to approval and amendment at the Annual Meeting of the Town Council, the provisional dates for the municipal year 2016-2017 are as follows:-

PRINCIPAL COUNCIL

Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council is the Principal Council, and serves the Borough with most local services such as schools, social services, waste collection and roads.

HOW IS THE TOWN COUNCIL FINANCED?

The net cost of the Town Council's activities is financed by levying what is known as a precept, which is added to the Council Tax levy set by Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council.

In 2015-2016 the Town Council raised £283,876 via the precept. In addition, the Town Council received £58,274 in Council Tax Reduction Scheme Grant (CTRSG) from Central Government. This was a reduction of 16.3% on the similar grant for the previous year. This continued fall in CTRSG, which has been reduced by over 29% in the last three years, continues to place a considerable strain on Town Council budgets.

Each year, the Town Councils' accounts are prepared by the Town Manager and are audited by the appointed Internal and External auditors.

The table below shows the aggregate levels of income and expenditure for 2015-2016 but at this stage, they are estimated outturn figures and are also subject to final audit. Once audited, details of the accounts are available for any residents' inspection.

2016-2017 PRECEPT

Against yet more cuts by Central Government in our Council Tax Support Grant, which has been reduced by just over £24,000 since 2013-2014; to maintain and improve our services. For 2016-2017, the Members of the Town Council reluctantly resolved to increase the precept in by 10%, the equivalent of £5.88 per annum at Band D equivalent level.

This increase, the first for two years, will enable the Town Council to meet its net expenditure for the year including the payment of the Living Wage to its lowest paid employees.

On this basis, it costs each Halewood Town elector 5.5 pence per day to finance the Town Council.

In addition to the precept, as a result of yet further Government cuts in the CTRSG, as mentioned above, the Town Council will only receive £51,290 in 2016-2017 a LOSS of approximately £7,000 compared to 2015-2016.

Naturally, this further loss of income will put increasing pressure on Town Council budgets.

STAFFING, ACCOMMODATION AND OPEN SPACES

Recently agreed changes to the staffing structure of the Town Council will eradicate duplication and further strengthen the centralisation of the administration and management of the Town Council at the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre. Furthermore, staffing levels at Hollies Hall and the associated sports facilities on that site, are planned to be increased in 2016-2017

In addition to land around the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre and Hollies Hall, both buildings owned and managed by the Town Council, we also lease and maintain over 90 acres of open space and woodland in and around Wood Road and Abberley Road, Doorstep Green (Dista Field) Elwyn Drive and New Hutte Woods.

The Town Council also provides and maintains three playgrounds for our young children at Hollies Road, Wood Road and at the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre.

WHAT DO WE DO?

Services currently provided by Halewood Town Council

- The Arncliffe Sports and Community
 Centre The administrative centre of the
 Town Council, 'The Arncliffe' provides a
 community sporting facility including a
 Sports Hall, two synthetic pitches and
 junior sized pitches used by Halewood
 Junior Football League. The Centre has a
 large function room complete with bar
 and kitchen facilities, up to date audio
 visual equipment all of which are available,
 at competitive rates, for private, or
 business hire. 'The Arncliffe' is home to
 many community and special interest
 groups who use the facilities for meetings
 and activities.
- Hollies Hall Home of the Halewood Indoor Bowls League, this popular venue, extensively refurbished in September 2014, also has a large function room complete with bar and kitchen facilities, which is available, at competitive rates, for private, or business hire. Hollies Hall too, is home to many community and special interest groups who use the facilities for meetings and activities. Outside, there are two full sized grassed football pitches which are available for hire.
- Public Open Spaces The Town Council manage around 90 acres of public open space. In addition to the open space associated with 'The Arncliffe' and Hollies Hall, the Town Council chiefly manages land on Wood Road and Elwyn Drive, as well as Halewood Doorstep Green (Dista Field), Frederick Lunt Playing Fields in Abberley Road and New Hutte Woods.
- Playgrounds maintenance of the current young persons' playgrounds at Hollies Road, Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre, and on Wood Road.

- Festive Lighting faced with the Principal Council's decision a few years ago to cease providing festive lighting at Christmas, the Town Council funds the provision of Christmas lights in the Shopping Centre on Leathers Lane.
- Street Furniture mainly within its own land, although not exclusively, the Town Council owns and maintains some of the benches, seats and notice boards within Halewood.
- Civic Services The Mayor of Halewood is always pleased to support any Halewoodbased resident, organisation or group as far as diary commitments allow. If you would like the Mayor to attend any event please contact The Mayor's Office on 0151 443 2063
- Halewood Community Grants Fund the Town Council maintains a fund, designed to support Halewood-based projects.
 Preference will be given to those schemes that stimulate new ideas and approaches which benefits the community.
- Planning Applications the Town Council monitors all planning applications applicable to areas within the Township, making representations to the Planning Authorities as necessary.
- Council Offices and Support Services –
 From its base in the Arncliffe Sports and
 Community Centre, the Town Council
 provides the full range of management,
 financial and administrative services to
 the Council, the Mayoralty and Civic
 events.

ACHIEVEMENTS 2015-2016

The Town Council continuously strives to improve the lives of the community of Halewood; as our motto says, 'we seek the best' the best for our community.

Here's just some of our achievements in 2015-2016...

- Living Wage Accreditation. In 2014 Halewood Town Council was proud to become the first Living Wage accredited Council on Merseyside. The Living Wage is an hourly rate set independently and updated annually. It is calculated according to the basic cost of living using the 'Minimum Income Standard' for the UK and is a social consensus about what people need to make ends meet. Proud to pay the Living Wage throughout 2015-2016, our budget provision for 2016-2017 will see the Town Council continue to pay the Living Wage.
- Despite the strain on our finances, Elected Members approved development work on much improved catering facilities at the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre which it is hoped will come to fruition in 2016-2017.
- The Town Council continued to monitor the many planning applications submitted to the Planning Authority and whilst accepting the vast majority, successfully objected to applications they considered contrary to planning policy and not in the interests of the Halewood community.

- The continuing success of the Town Council's Community Grants Fund which has once again supported local organisations in 2015-2016 by distributing almost £13,000 to worthy causes.
- Our children and young people of Halewood are a source of great pride to our community. To recognise their fortitude, courage and determination, a nominee from Halewood Children's Centres, Halewood Academy and each of our Primary schools are due to be the proud recipients of this year's Town Council's Pupil Recognition Awards.
- Similarly, those members of our community who 'go the extra mile' to help others, are due to be recognised at our Community Achievement Awards.
- This year the Town Council was proud to support Al's Club, a volunteer-led club for disabled young people between the ages of 17-25, by hosting a Community Fun Day at the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre.

Situated in Arncliffe Road, the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre is a popular venue for a variety of social and community events. With car parking available, a fully stocked bar and function room complete with audio visual equipment, the Centre is an ideal venue which can be hired for an assortment of celebrations, including christenings, 18th and 21st birthday parties and many other birthday celebrations, children's parties, anniversaries and funeral receptions.

As well as being the administrative base for the Town Council, it is also the base from which many groups deliver their activities and is the home of Halewood Town Sports Association and the Halewood Junior Football League.

Sports Facilities at the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre

In 2007, a grant of £600,000 from Barclays Bank and the Football Foundation, together with £150,000 each from Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council, and Halewood Town Council, realised a major improvement to the sporting facilities at the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre. Thanks to this funding, the Centre has a large Sports Hall, floodlight synthetic surfaces, a multi use games area and changing facilities.

In recent times, the synthetic surface has begun to show signs of coming to the end of its useful life. As a result, the Town Council is planning to upgrade the facilities by replacing the existing sand-filled surface with 3G.

The Town Council are responsible for the running of these upgraded facilities which are available for hire at very competitive rates.
