## Town Manager's Report

It's that time of the year again when I look back over the last year and try to sum it up in a few paragraphs, an almost impossible task!

As Cllr Hogg mentions in his foreword, the year started sadly, with the death of Town and Borough Councillor Tina Harris and former Town and Borough Councillor Tommy Fearn. Both Tina and Tommy, were hard-working, loyal, faithful and dependable and their wise counsel is sadly missed.

The Borough Council's decision early in the municipal year to reverse its policy to establish a Trust to manage the parks and open spaces in the Borough had a significant effect on the business of the Town Council during the year.

Notwithstanding this, the Town Council again faced the financial challenge of austerity imposed by Central Government and yet managed to agree a budget, details of which are shown on page 7.

Even though the Town Council faced difficult financial challenges, it still recognised that some of our families are themselves facing similar worries. So with the continued support of our Primary Schools, and because Members considered it the right thing to do, the Town Council again this year, set aside a fund to help those in most need. In addition to providing direct support to families via schools,

working with partners, the Town Council also provided funding to secure hot meals for our young people during the summer holidays.

On the brighter side, the Town Council was delighted to support, both practically and financially, the Halewood Christmas Concert. For the first time this year the concert featured an ensemble from the Manchester Camerata. The concert entitled 'Mr Jum's Christmas', once again showcased the talents of our the young people from our Primary Schools, Halewood Academy and Halewood Community Choir.

Our Christmas concert wasn't the Town Council's only contribution to the festive season, we once again funded three seasonal pantomimes and under the management of our Premises and Communities Officer, the staff of the Town Council organised a sell out Christmas Party for our young people which was held in Hollies Hall.

Acknowledging the growing issue of 'Period Poverty' and building on the work done by Torrington Drive Community Association (TDCA) at New Hutte Neighbourhood Centre, the Town Council agreed to provide free sanitary products in all of the female toilets in its buildings and in partnership with TDCA and the Big Help Project, we also implemented a programme of similar free provision throughout most public accessible female toilets in the Township.....another 'first' for Halewood amongst the other Parish and Town Council in Knowsley.

Our continued support to many activities, groups and individuals during the year saw grants being made to Halewood Culturefest, Halewood Community Spirit, Derby Court Residents Association, The Tuesday Club and Halewood Youth in Community Centre (The Boyzee) (to name but a few).

Another highlight in the year came through our Pupil Recognition Award and Community Achievement Awards which rightly recognised the talent and fortitude of our young people and of those members of the community who go 'above and beyond'.

## About Halewood Town Council

### ELECTED REPRESENTATIVES (TOWN COUNCILLORS)

The Town Council has twelve Members (Town Councillor) who (ordinarily) serve for a period of four years.

At the Town Council elections in May 2015, all twelve Members were elected unopposed, however, during 2016, following the resignation of one Member, after due legal process the resultant vacancy was filled by co-option. Following the sad death of Cllr Tina Harris in June 2018, a by election was held and as result of this, at the end of the municipal year for which this report is produced the Elected Members of Halewood Town Council were as follows:

**North Ward – Cllrs Ken Dalton, Dean Perry, Edna Finneran and Clare Rose**  
**South Ward – Cllrs Steve Ball, Barbara Dunn, Allan Harvey and David Samuels**  
**West Ward – Cllrs Norman Hogg, Bob Swann, Ian Scott Hamilton and Ann Farrell.**

Whilst Town Councillors may be paid an allowance, Members of Halewood Town Council receive no allowance at all and give of their time freely and voluntarily to serve their community.

The Community Governance Review carried out by the Principal Authority during 2018/19 confirmed the number of Elected Members of the Town Council at twelve with six Members each being elected to represent new Town Council wards, Halewood North and Halewood South wards.

Details of the current elected representatives are shown on the Town Council's website.

### COUNCIL STRUCTURE & GOVERNANCE

The responsibility of the Council is to take policy decisions about how it's services are carried out, what the priorities should be and how the Council's resources should be allocated.

Each year, at the Annual Meeting, the Council elects a Chairperson who becomes the Mayor of Halewood for the forthcoming year. For 2018-2019 the Chairperson of the Council and Mayor of Halewood, was Cllr Norman Hogg who was supported throughout the year by his wife Wendy.

The Town Council doesn't 'make the rules up as it goes along' so to speak; there must be a legal basis for everything it does. Governance arrangements for Town and Parish Councils in England goes back many years the most recent significant piece of legislation arguably being the Local Government Act 1972. However, the overall package of legislation goes back well before that, even to the 19th century.

Standing Orders are intended to regulate and control how the Town Council conducts its business and whilst there is no obligation to adopt Standing Orders, it is good practice to do so and for many years Halewood Town Council considers and adopts on an annual basis, Standing Orders and Financial Regulations.

The Council has a statutory duty under the Localism Act 2011 to promote and maintain high standards of conduct by Elected Members and Co-opted Members Code of Conduct, which is again adopted on an annual basis, sets out the standards which the Council therefore expects such Members to observe.

### **PUBLIC ACCESS TO AND PARTICIPATION AT TOWN COUNCIL MEETINGS (INCLUDING PUBLIC RECORDING)**

Meetings of the Town Council are not public meetings but members of the public have a statutory right to attend any meeting of the Town Council but only as an observer. Unless invited to do so by the Chairperson, members of the public have no right to speak at Town Council meetings.

That said, a thirty minute 'Public Forum' is currently available at all meetings of Halewood Town Council when, preferably by prior arrangement with the Town Manager, members of the public in attendance at the meeting may, at the Chairperson's discretion, address the Town Council on matters appertaining to the Township.

There are occasions when meetings must go into 'private session' when dealing with matters of a confidential nature. On these occasions members of the public (and press if any are present) must leave.

In line with national legislation, and in accordance with the Town Council's Policy, the filming and recording of public Town Council meetings is permitted.

Anybody wishing to film and record public meetings is asked to inform the Town Manager 24 hours in advance of their intention to record a meeting to ensure that the necessary arrangements can be made.

### **PRINCIPAL COUNCIL**

Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council is the Principal Council, and serves the Borough with most local services such as schools, social services, waste collection and roads.



## HOW IS THE TOWN COUNCIL FINANCED?

The net cost of the Town Council's activities is financed by levying what is known as a precept, which is added to the Council Tax levy set by Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council.

In 2018-2019 the Town Council raised £372,403 via the precept. Up until 2017-2018 the Town Council also received a grant from Central Government called the Council Tax Reduction Scheme Grant (CTRSG). As a result of the austerity measures imposed by Central Government and the stance taken by Knowsley MBC, 2018-2019 saw the cessation of this grant and in fact the £372,403 raised via the precept in 2018-2019 was £11,000 less than received the previous year.

Each year, the Town Councils' accounts are prepared by the Town Manager and are audited by the appointed Internal and External auditors.

Each year also, as required by law, electors of the Township can 'Exercise their Rights' to inspect the accounts of the Town Council within a given period, details of which are posted on the Town Council's website and on the Town Council's notice boards throughout the Township.

The table below shows the aggregate levels of income and expenditure for 2018-2019, and at this stage, they are subject to final audit. Once audited, details of the accounts are available for residents' inspection.

## 2019–2020 BUDGET AND PRECEPT

The net cost of the Town Council's activities is financed by levying what is known as a precept, which is added to the Council Tax levy set by Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council.

Members of Halewood Town Council are acutely aware of the financial pressures facing the residents of Halewood which seem to increase with each and every announcement from Central Government.

Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council (KMBC) themselves have publicised details of the funding cuts they have received from Central Government; cuts which Halewood Town Council has also had to bear.

These relentless cuts in public funding such as the scrapping the Council Tax Reduction Scheme Grant have meant that in the five years your Town Council has suffered a real terms cut in its funding of £75,000.

Nevertheless, the Members of the Town Council are committed to improving its assets and its service to the community,

including increasing by 50% the level of its General Grants Fund, continuing the financial support to the most vulnerable children and families in our community via our schools and providing an employment opportunity via the Knowsley Apprenticeship Scheme.

The sustained nature of cuts and Members' commitment to protect and improve services leaves the Town Council little option in 2019/20 but to increase the precept by 9.5%.

Whilst this may sound a large increase, on a Band D property, it equates to an increase of £6.83 per year, less than 2p per day. However, in reality 86% of our residents will pay much less, with Band A properties, (38% of the total in Halewood) paying an increase of £4.55 per year, less than 1.25p per day.

In total terms, these figures will enable Members and staff of Halewood Town Council, to continue to provide much needed services to the residents of the Township.

## What Do We Do?

### Services currently provided by Halewood Town Council

- **The Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre** – The administrative centre of the Town Council, 'The Arncliffe' provides a community sporting facility including a Sports Hall, two synthetic pitches and junior sized pitches used by Halewood Junior Football League. The Centre has a large function room complete with bar, extensive kitchen facilities, up to date audio visual equipment and is home to many community and special interest groups who use the facilities for meetings and activities. 'The Arncliffe' is also available for hire at competitive rates for a variety of business, family or fundraising events.
- **Hollies Hall** – Home of the Halewood Indoor Bowls League, our other popular venue, also has a large function room complete with bar and kitchen facilities. Recently obtained audio visual equipment compliment the facility, which is also available, at competitive rates, for private, or business hire. Hollies Hall too, is home to many community and special interest groups who use the facilities for meetings and activities. Outside, Hilton Grace Recreation Ground, extensively used by Kingsthorpe Junior Football Club is available for outdoor sporting and recreational activities.
- **Open Spaces** – The Town Council manage around 90 acres of open space. In addition to the open space associated with 'The Arncliffe' and Hollies Hall, the Town Council chiefly manages land on Wood Road, Halewood Doorstep Green (Dista Field), Frederick Lunt Playing Field, New Hutte Woods and Elwyn Gardens which the Town Council owns.
- **Playgrounds** – Within our Open Spaces, the Town Council is responsible for the up-keep and maintenance of the current young persons' playgrounds at Hollies Road, Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre, and on Wood Road. Sadly, wanton vandalism has left the Town Council with little alternative but to control access times to our playgrounds wherever possible.
- **Festive Lighting** – faced with the Principal Council's decision a few years ago to cease providing festive lighting at Christmas, the Town Council funds the provision of Christmas lights in the Shopping Centre on Leathers Lane.
- **Street Furniture** – mainly within its own land, although not exclusively, the Town Council owns and maintains some of the benches and seats within Halewood plus newly designed and erected Town Council notice boards throughout the Township.
- **Civic Services** – The Mayor of Halewood is always pleased to support any Halewood-based resident, organisation or group as far as diary commitments allow. If you would like the Mayor to attend any event please contact The Mayor's Office on 0151 443 2063.
- **Halewood Community Grants Fund** –the Town Council maintains a fund, designed to support Halewood-based projects. Preference will be given to those schemes that stimulate new ideas and approaches which benefits the community.

- **Planning Applications** – the Town Council monitors all planning applications applicable to areas within the Township, making representations to the Planning Authorities as necessary.
- **Events** – A series of Town Council sponsored, delivered and at times fully funded, events takes place throughout the year. In 2018-2019, these events included:
  - three seasonal pantomimes at Christmas,
  - Children's Christmas Party,
  - Town Council Summer Fun Day
  - Sport, Nutrition and Active Play (SNAP) a programme of free events for children and families in our parks and open spaces linked to holiday hunger.
- **Council Offices and Support Services** – From its base in the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre, the Town Council provides the full range of management, financial and administrative services to the Council, the Mayoralty and Civic events.

## Achievements 2018–2019

The Town Council continuously strives to improve the lives of the community of Halewood; as our motto says, **'we seek the best'** the best for our community.

Here's just some of our achievements in 2018-2019....

- In 2014 Halewood Town Council was proud to become the first Living Wage accredited Council on Merseyside. The Living Wage is an hourly rate set independently and updated annually. It is calculated according to the basic cost of living using the 'Minimum Income Standard' for the UK and is a social consensus about what people need to make ends meet. Proud to pay the Living Wage throughout 2018-2019, our budget provision for 2019 - 2020 will see the Town Council continue to pay the Living Wage.
- The Town Council continued to monitor the many planning applications submitted to the Planning Authority and whilst accepting the vast majority, successfully objected to applications they considered contrary to planning policy and not in the interests of the Halewood community.
- The hugely successful planning and delivery of the Town Council Fun Day on Hilton Grace Recreation Ground. This event attracted over 4,000 visitors and is planned to be an annual event on the Town Council's calendar. **Fun Day 2019 is to be held on SATURDAY 3rd AUGUST.**



- The continuing success of the Town Council's Community Grants Fund which has once again supported local organisations in 2018-2019 by distributing almost £12,000 to worthy causes.
- Our children and young people of Halewood are a source of great pride to our community. To recognise their fortitude, courage and determination, a nominee from Halewood Children's Centres, Halewood Academy and each of our Primary schools were the proud recipients of this year's Town Council's Pupil Recognition Awards.
- Similarly, those members of our community who 'go the extra mile' to help others, were recognised at our Community Achievement Awards.
- The funding of our seasonal pantomimes at the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre, Hollies Hall, New Hutte Neighbourhood Centre.

- Our Children's Christmas party attracted 100 young people and some family members as well to a lovely celebration complete with a visit from Father Christmas.
- During the year the Town Council also have a commitment to develop a plan to combat Domestic Abuse which would include:
  - Identification of a Lead Staff and Elected Member
  - The development of an overarching 'Safeguarding Policy'
  - Consideration of accreditation to White Ribbon UK
  - A commitment that staff and Elected Members do not engage in any behaviour that could be considered abusive with the appropriate signage saying that perpetrators will not be tolerated and information provided promoting and raising awareness of the issue.
  - Involve the local community through holding one event a year to raise awareness.
- The 2018 Christmas Dinner programme which once again this year saw some of our much loved Senior Citizens and members and supporters of Knowsley Dementia Care - Memory Lane, come to the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre for their Christmas Dinner.
- Following negotiations with our Head Teacher colleagues, the establishment of a Town Council fund to provide much needed support to the most vulnerable of our Children and Families in relation to the purchase of school uniforms.
- Recognising that food poverty is a reality for some families in our community and working with Halewood Children's Centres, Torrington Drive Community Association and other partners, the Town Council authorised funds to provide hot meals for young people during the school summer holidays as part of a series of sporting and active play activities throughout our parks and open spaces under the banner of SNAP.

- In addition to funding, the Town Council took a leading role in the planning and organising of the hugely successful Christmas Concert held at the Halewood Academy in December and which featured an ensemble from the Manchester Camerata supporting a massed choir from all of our Primary schools, Halewood Academy and Halewood Community Choir.
- At the request of and working alongside Knowsley Dementia Care Support - Memory Lane, the Town Council agreed to support the development of a Dementia Friendly 'Sensory Garden' at the rear of the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre and we look forward to its opening in 2019-2020.
- Our continued support to Halewood Junior Football League, Halewood Community Spirit, Halewood Culturefest and others in bringing a variety of sports, culture and just plain fun events to the community of Halewood.
- In conjunction with the Big Help project, GET CONNECTED offers free one to one advice and support in the following areas:  
**Debt Advice**- trained advisors from the Jubilee Debt Advice team help clients to manage their personal finances, deal with debt problems and manage a budget.  
**Next Steps** - staff from the Next Steps team support clients back into work and assist with searching for the right job or course, creating a CV, preparing for an interview.  
**Digital and Financial Inclusion** - clients are shown how to use the Internet,

looking at work and training opportunities, searching for the best utility offers, making cheaper purchases, opening a Credit Union or bank account.

**GET CONNECTED** is available at the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre every Thursday from 12 noon - 2pm.

- Faced with the possible demise of the popular Halewood Health Forum, the Town Council agreed to fund the continued meetings of this group which provides much information and support to the community.

### Sports Facilities at the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre

In 2007, a grant of £600,000 from Barclays Bank and the Football Foundation, together with £150,000 each from Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council, and Halewood Town Council, realised a major improvement to the sporting facilities at the Arncliffe Sports and Community Centre. Thanks to this funding, the Centre has a large Sports Hall, floodlight synthetic surfaces, a multi use games area and changing facilities.

In 2017, the Town Council funded the complete replacement of the synthetic (sand-based) surface with modern 3G and this floodlit facility is available for hire at very competitive rates.
